

Death by electrocution from photovoltaic panels

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Abstract: At 5:00 p.m. on June 23, 2022, an employee was working on a roof-mounted solar panel system when he made contact with an energized electrical component.

As the use of solar energy continues to grow in California and nationally, an increasing number of workers are exposed to unique hazards than can cause injury or death.

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Solar energy workers are exposed to potential electrical hazards at work, "which makes them more vulnerable to the danger of electrocution and arc flash hazards," OSHA said.

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
