OverviewClassificationsShapeConstructionFittingsFurther readingSails may be classified as either triangular, which describes sails that either come to one point of suspension at the top or where the sail comes to a point at the forward end, or quadrilateral, which includes sails that are attached to a spar at the top and have three other sides, or as square. They also may be classified as symmetrical (square sails and symmetric spinnakers) or asymmetrical (most other sails). Typically, asymmetrical sails perform better on points of sail closer to the wind than symmetrical ...

The lower corner nearest to the mast is called the Tack, the corner at the top of the mast is the Head in a triangular bermudian sail and a Throat in a Spritsail.

What are triangular sails called? A lateen (from French latine, meaning "Latin") or latin-rig is a triangular sail set on a long yard mounted at an angle on the mast, and running in a fore-and-aft direction.

Triangular sails have names for each of three edges and three corners, explained below. Rigs with such sails include Bermuda, cutter, lateen and vessels with mixed sail plans that include jibs and other staysails.

The lateen sail is triangular in shape set on a long, sloping yard and is mounted to the mast at its middle. It runs in a fore-and-aft direction. The lateen sail can take the wind from either side of the sail. Later on, the sail was ...
